

#### <u>Deacon Steve Szmutko's Reflection on the Sunday Readings</u> <u>Easter Reflection: From the Easter Vigil – Luke 24: 1-12</u>

"Why do you seek the living on among the dead? He is not here, but he has been raised. Remember what he said to you while he was still in Galilee, that the Son of Man must be handed over to sinners and be crucified, and rise on the third day." (Luke 24: 5b-7)

As the first pale light of dawn brightened the eastern sky, the sorrowful women gathered the burial spices and slowly made their way, disappearing into ashen shadows to the tomb of Jesus. No joy burned in their hearts; the journey was one of solemn duty. Within the hewn crevice, the body of their Lord and Master lay cold and lifeless, awaiting the women's final ministrations before it would forever be committed to the earth. Thus would end the time of Jesus of Nazareth: teacher, healer, master . . . and bloodied victim of human cruelty. Yet as they approached, they saw something through the morning shadows that they did not expect. The stone that had sealed the tomb had been rolled aside. The tomb was empty; only the burial cloths remained. This was puzzling, disturbing. Where was the body of Jesus?

As they stood in bewilderment, two men in dazzling garments appeared. Angels? Messengers? "He is not here. He has been raised. Could it be true? Had what the Lord proclaimed come to pass? They remembered his words. They raced to tell the others. While the women were greeted with skepticism, Peter himself ran to the tomb and confirmed the sight. And, as the hours and

days unfolded, the reality of the resurrection became apparent to all of the disciples. Jesus Christ is risen today: alleluia! At each Eucharistic Vigil, the liturgy begins in darkness. With the first glow of the Easter fire, the Paschal Candle is lit. As it is carried into the church, each person lights their individual candles from that first fire. As the flames flicker, the shadows of darkness are scattered by the wondrous light of faith. The darkness of the tomb is banished. Christ, the light of the World, shines ever more brightly until the entire community is awash in a dazzling garment of Easter joy.

We celebrate the resurrection of the Lord and bask in the light of redemption. We welcome those who are brought into the fullness of the Catholic faith and pray that they, and all of us, continue to grow in loving relationship with the risen Christ. As we share in the Precious Body and Blood of Jesus, let us never forget his wondrous Paschal Mystery. We have shared the despair of Calvary; let us now bask in the light of Easter joy. The splendor of the resurrected Lord forever banishes the formless shadows of the tomb.

"Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again."
