FEBRUARY 26TH ~ THE FIRST SUNDAY OF LENT

te Temptation of Christ by the Devil, c. 1633–35, Christoffel Jegher, after Peter Paul Rubens. At that time Jesus was led by the Spirit into the desert to be tempted by the devil. He fasted for forty days and forty nights, and afterwards he was hungry. (Gospel)

1st Sunday of Lent Gen 2:7-9;3:1-7; Ps 51:4-6,12-13,17; Rom 5:12-19; Mt 4:1-11

The Lord, your God, shall you worship and him alone shall you serve.

Our readings today focus on temptation and two disparate responses found in the Scriptures. In the first reading from Genesis, Satan — in the guise of a serpent tempted Adam and Eve to disobey God's command. Despite the Lord's blessings, the first man and woman sought to become like God, estranging themselves from the Creator and the state of paradise in which they had been placed. Adam and Eve turned from a state of abundance and succumbed to the evil that characterizes so much of human endeavor. However, as revealed throughout Sacred Scripture, God continued to reach out, establishing a loving Covenant and promising the Messiah, despite the ongoing failure of His people to remain faithful. At last, in the fullness of time, he sent His only begotten son fully divine, fully human yet without sin — to enter into the world in order to offer himself in expiation for our sins.

In the reading from the Gospel of Matthew, Jesus was led into the desert to be tempted by the devil. Knowing the true nature of Jesus, Satan sought to dissuade him from his mission. Three times, he appealed to the baser instincts of man; yet each time, Jesus spurned Satan, remaining faithful to the will of the Father. Christ's fidelity to his redemptive mission would endure throughout his ministry, culminating with his ultimate sacrifice

— Jesus' suffering and death on the Cross. It was this paschal sacrifice by which sin and death were vanquished and humanity was restored to a place in the Kingdom.

Evil thrives in separation and isolation. Satan preys upon our fears, eager to exploit any weakness, and ready to divide us from each other and from God, just as he did with Adam and Eve. He works in darkness and despair, tempting us to eschew our intimate relationship with the loving Creator. Satan's work has been made manifest throughout the centuries, even to the present day, when humanity turns from the face of God, elevating golden idols in His stead. It is only by faith and trust in Jesus Christ, that we can withstand evil. Only by accepting him into our hearts can we banish Satan back to the darkness from which he came.

As we enter these forty days of Lent, let us renew our faith and trust in the Lord. Through prayer, devotion, and sacrifice, let us prepare our hearts, minds and spirits so that, as we journey with Jesus to Calvary, we might come to know the bliss of Easter Joy — the celebration of his resurrection. Jesus and the Jewish Roots of the Eucharist: Unlocking the Secrets of the Last Supper by Brant Pitre

Jesus and the Jewish Roots of the Eucharist shines fresh light on the Last Supper by looking at it through Jewish eyes.
