## *September 12, 2021 ~ Twenty-fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time*

**Deacon Steve's Reflection on Sunday's Readings September 12, 2021**

***"So also faith of itself, if it does not have works, is dead." (James 2: 17)***

Twenty years ago, on a bright clear Tuesday morning, I went for a brisk early walk through the Georgetown section before the start of an economic development conference in Washington. Our schedule was filled with meetings and later, a visit to Capitol Hill and a White House VIP tour was on the agenda. Wandering through quaint streets lined with brick townhouses, I found only quiet and tranquility. My thoughts were turned to family, especially of our daughter Eva who had begun her studies at New York University in Manhattan. What a lovely way to start a beautiful late summer day! Upon my return to my hotel room, I showered and dressed for the morning conference. As I flicked off the television to head downstairs, there was a brief mention on the morning show about a small plane crash in New York City.

Not long afterwards, the conference room was interrupted with news that two planes – large commercial passenger jetliners actually – had crashed into the World Trade Center, while a third aircraft had slammed into the Pentagon. A fourth plane was rumored to be hurtling to the White House – mere blocks from the hotel. America was under attack! Not on some distant shore, the attack was here and now. And our daughter, Eva, was in Manhattan!

We gathered around a nearby television set and watched as the towers burned and crumbled. My thoughts were elsewhere. Where was our daughter? Was she safe? Were there more attacks to come? What could I do? The last question was the most unsettling. Men – husbands and fathers in particular – often live with the illusion of complete control over their lives and those of their families. Only when such momentous events occur, do we realize how little we, as individuals, can do amidst such chaos. Cell phones and all landlines were dead. I borrowed a hotel staffer's computer and sent a blast email to anyone whose address I could remember: "I'm fine! Have you heard from Eva???"

How does one reconcile their faith in a loving merciful God, in the face of such evil? Many people struggle with that question today, twenty years later. Millions of prayers were uttered that day – prayers of concern, prayers for deliverance, prayers for strength, prayers uttered in terror, prayers that seemed to echo into a fog of ash, dust, and debris. Where was God in all of this? Where was His answer to our prayers? And, as the source of the attacks became apparent, another question: What sort of faith would compel individuals of self-proclaimed "piety" to slaughter innocent men, women and children in horrifying fire and smoke?

In the Letter of Saint James, we hear of the sort of faith that may offer the better way, one that reveals itself not merely in dogma, but in dogma lived out in love, kindness, and compassion, in our relationship with God and with all men and women.

*"What good is it, my brothers, if someone says he has faith but does not have works? Can that faith save him? If a brother or sister has nothing to wear and has no food for the day, and one of you says to them, "Go in peace, keep warm, and eat well," but you do not give them the necessities of the body, what good is it? So also faith of itself, if it does not have works, is dead. Indeed, someone may say, "You have faith and I have works." Demonstrate your faith to me without works, and I will demonstrate my faith to you from my works." (James 2: 14-18)*

Saint James tells us that faith is more than uttered words; it is a life oriented to God, lived in loving relation to each other. Our disposition to the needs of others gives voice to our beliefs. It is readily apparent to all people of goodwill that those who acted in mindless rage were not persons of faith. Rather, they were twisted personifications of evil, men who sought to manipulate through terror, the lives of others in a manner diametrically opposed to the will of God, the one LORD of Christianity, Judaism, and Islam – indeed the one LORD of all the earth.

So, where was God? Amidst the tragedy of that day, can any person adequately answer that question? For my part, I believe that God was indeed present: in the hearts of those who risked life and limb, heroically laboring in an attempt to save others; in the singular acts of courage, kindness and compassion among men and women tangled in a common web of tragedy; and, in the efforts of family, friends, acquaintances and strangers who sought to bring consolation to the inconsolable. Indeed, the face of God was in all who served valiantly, reaching out to others in the midst of indescribable horror. Their faith, expressed either consciously or subconsciously, was expressed in the "doing" of the moment. Truly, they demonstrated their faith (whatever it may have been) from their works.

After excruciating moments of uncertainty, news of Eva's safety brought prayers of thanksgiving. Others were not so fortunate. For the families who live in continued sorrow and mourning, each day begins a renewed struggle to comprehend the incomprehensible. Even after twenty years, those directly impacted continue to suffer as lives and memories lost on that day continue to pierce the hearts of many with a sword. And yet, despite the loss of so many that day, there have been men and women, sons and daughters of first responders, who have followed in their fathers' footsteps as police and firemen. A reminder that good remains in the world!

As we remember the events of September 11th, and other events of evil, we are challenged to express our faith not in mere words, but in "doing" – courageously offering our entire being in the work of the Lord, to alleviate pain and heartbreak. It has been twenty years, yet we still suffer from the same challenges both here and throughout the world. Only in word and deed, in the transformation of our entire being in loving service, can we be truly Christian, and truly human.

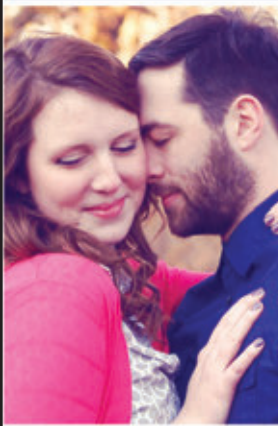
